

The Resurrection Men of Kelso

A Talk by Andrew Armstrong

We all know about the infamous case of Burke and Hare. But did you know that over a century earlier, Kelso had its very own bodysnatchers or resurrection men? This talk explores the location of the events, the resulting court case and the interesting individuals involved.

The long awaited rain which fell in early September raised River levels throughout the catchment. The first day however, brought a large amount of sediment and drifting weed into our waters of the Teviot. As the water cleared on the fine down of the second day, reports came of one or two fish being caught by anglers eager to enjoy the first opportunity to fish after such a long period of low water. The main cohort of salmon do appear, according to catch reports, to have remained on the lower beats of the main river. Perhaps further rain will hopefully, in the next few weeks, encourage those salmon to move up into our Waters.

The association outing to Sweethope in August turned out to be a better day than at first envisaged. The arrival of the coach at the fishery car park gave anglers a view of the lough in conditions that were less than encouraging, flat calm and floating algae. Not in any way good for fishing. Fortunately the breeze picked up and dispersed the green film for the rest of the day. Dry fly was the most successful method for most but the usual bright still water patterns also produced fish. Many thanks to Dave Welsh for organising the finances, boat hire and most importantly the buffet in the Bay Horse Inn.

Trout fishing on our waters is continuing to fall below expectations for September. Fly life and rising fish are both best described as sparse.

Grayling were caught in good numbers as the water temperature cooled from the height of the heat wave and in spite of the low water levels some decent fish were caught.

The Tweed Foundation biologist was asked to survey the underwater life in the Teviot to ascertain the numbers and range of creatures making up the food source of Trout and juvenile Salmon. The accepted method across all scientific bodies in the country is to use a fine meshed net to collect a sample over a three minute period of kicking the river bottom to dislodge insects into the net. The sample is then analysed with different species identified and logged onto a score sheet. Allowing for the fact that most insects will have hatched during the Summer and the remaining eggs deposited will be too small to see without the use of a microscope, the sample was rather disappointing. Salmon Parr need a good supply of food as they grow in their first years in the river. Hopefully a sample taken in the Spring will be more encouraging.



Gardening Tips from Woodside

Autumn is now upon us and the bright colours of the summer garden are fading, and it's time to turn our attention to winter and all year round interest plants.

Conifers often suffer from bad press, but they really are fantastic plants which allow you to enjoy colour and structure in the garden 365 days of the year, and the best part of all is that they are so easy to grow it hardly takes any effort!

The foliage of conifers is surprisingly varied in colour with shades of blue/grey, green, orange, yellow and variegated foliage all adding character to your garden. They also come in different shapes for different garden situations – prostrate for groundcover, columns and cones for accent points, bushy for screening and gap filling, and ball shapes for feature planting. And of course there are hedging varieties too. A bit of pruning is sometimes required to keep the shape you need, but always try and work with the natural shape to get the best results. Columnar conifers benefit from being bound with twine over the winter to prevent the wind and snow distorting the shape, but done well this is hardly visible.

People often worry about the height of conifers, so it's important to choose the growth rate that fits your needs. Take time to read the label and it will give you an indication of the annual growth rate. They vary from very slow (1-3cm per year) which are conifers suitable for alpine troughs, rockeries and container, to very fast (25-30cm per year) which make excellent screening plants, and all the growth rates in between. Don't forget that conifers keep growing, so don't be caught out by the labels stating the height after 10 years.

Conifers, when planted in a garden and mixed with other plants, provide a haven for wildlife. Birds appreciate the shelter for roosting all year round, and many will also nest in conifers, insects will pupate in the bark, and spiders find them the perfect habitat for their webs. Conifers also help the planet by absorbing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and storing it as carbon for many years. With conifers in many gardens the in the UK the benefit soon accumulates, so even by planting one conifer you are helping to make a difference.

My favourites include Picea glauca Sanders Blue – a slow growing dwarf Spruce in a neat cone shape with blue tinged needles, Thuja plicata Whipcord – a bizarre mound forming conifer with dreadlock like foliage, Tsuga Coles Prostrate – a beautiful ground covering plant with dense carpets of foliage, and Cupressus Wilma – a cheerful yellow foliage upright conifer, great for planting in containers and surrounding with pansies or violas for autumn and winter impact.

As you can tell, I'm a big fan of conifers when planted in the right place, as they are so varied in character and so easy to grow. They associate well with other shrubs such as Pieris and Physocarpus, and they can be underplanted with heathers for a traditional look, or with a wide range of perennial plants for a softer appearance. They are also very useful in pots as you can use them as the centre-piece all year round and add bedding plants throughout the year for seasonal interest.

Plant with a good compost – I recommend Growmoor Multi-purpose Compost with added John Innes, and plenty of Rootgrow for a head start and top off with composted bark for a tidy finish and to help improve soil structure. Don't forget to feed each growing season with fertiliser to keep them looking fresh and healthy so that you have many years of enjoyment season after season.

Self-directed Support - what is it?

Self-directed Support (SDS) is the way people access social care and support in Scotland. It is designed to be a flexible way for people who need care and support to choose how this is provided and who provides it for them.

There are four Self-directed Support options. The option you choose will depend on the amount of control and involvement you want to have.

Option 1 - Direct Payment (DP)

With this option the Council will pay your individual budget straight to you or to an agreed third party. You can then choose and arrange your own care. You can get help with this from *Encompass (more details below).

Option 2 - Individual Service Fund (ISF)

You choose a Care Provider who will manage your individual budget on your behalf. You then work with your provider to arrange your support.

Option 3 - Social Work managed

Social Work will make all support arrangements and manage your care for you.

Option 4 - A mix of the above

The first step for anyone who may need social care is an assessment from Scottish Borders Council Social Work department, to work out if you are eligible for social care and what that care should look like to help you best.

How do I get help with this?

Our first term of 2025/2026 has started with new faces and old. We are embracing the changes of more 2 year olds in our ELC and being one class of P1-7 in the school.

Since starting back this term in ELC we have been shape detectives. We have been out and about round the village hunting for shapes in our environment, we found all the shapes on our shape hunting sheet. We continued this within the setting doing lots of activities that involved using shapes like making shape patterns with the threading beads.

We have also been looking at our emotions and how we are feeling. We have introduced a mood wall using our mood monster cushions. We identified each of the emotions then talked about how they make us feel and what we can do to support each other with our emotions. Each morning, we move our photo to the emotion that best describes how we are feeling and use it

throughout the day to express any changes to our feelings.

We then combined our emotions and shape theme together and made a mood shape monster. We used shapes to create the monster then drew on a face to show how it was feeling. We even chose shapes in the colours that represented the emotion our monster was feeling.

In the school, our term began with the development of our Class Charter using the UN Convention of the Rights of the Child. In our class we want everyone be safe, respected, hard working and kind. We have discussed that we all have a part to play in this.

Our Primary 7 pupil has just returned from an amazing residential with pupils from Morebattle, Ednam and Edenside. Her favourite things were the raft building and the trapeze.



Our hard work in the classroom is still being complemented by learning outdoor and enjoying the amazing area that we live in. Our Social Subjects topic is Castles and our Science focus is on materials so we had a great afternoon down by the Bowmont building castles. The children worked well together demonstrating great knowledge of how to build safe and secure structures despite limited resources.

That is us 5 games in to the season by the time this edition is circulated. As I write we have won 2 home games against Hawick and Melrose. Low scoring and not a lot of free flowing rugby but our defence has been solid and the faithful have gone home happy. An unusual feature of the league programme is a player welfare week where there are no Premier or National league games on the last weekend of September. This gives every player the opportunity to get their Christmas shopping done early. I don't want to tempt fate but we have been very well behaved on the pitch with no yellow cards. A few penalties but no cards! Our injuries have mostly been to the lower limb & there are several moon boots wandering around Poynder. We wish all affected players a speedy recovery. We have now been able to access our drafted players. Each Premier club has been allocated a share of the professional and Academy players from Glasgow and Edinburgh. We have used 3 drafted players so far but some on our list are not very likely to appear in the Black and White as they are more established players & will be used by Edinburgh in the United Rugby Championship.

The Clubrooms are no longer like a building site as the work on the lift and the accessible toilet upstairs have been completed and opened officially at the Hawick game. The Club is most grateful to the groups and individuals who have generously help fund this expensive but worthwhile project.

The Sharks have also got good numbers training and are well into their Border Junior League programme. Most of the league games will be played on Friday nights. The benefit of this move is that there is a greater likelihood of referees being allocated and it also gives players and spectators a night out on Friday as well as being able to access games on the Saturday afternoons.

Members were invited to an Extraordinary Annual General Meeting on 15th September to discuss the status in terms of governance of the Club. The Management Committee sought permission from the members to carry out all acts required to incorporate a company limited by guarantee within 18 months. This was passed unanimously by those attending. A sub-committee will now start to process this but will always keep the members informed of the progress.

They had a break in July to recharge their batteries. They recently took part in a tournament at the Hive at Murrayfield and entered into the true spirit of Walking Rugby by participating well. There is no truth in the rumour that they are being bankrolled by the Foresters in Pathhead!

The club has launched a Youth Rugby lottery, which has replaced the 200 Club, through Support Sport Lottery. It is a national lottery and we would encourage supporters to participate. It costs £1 per week and further information can be received on www.supportsportlottery/kelso-rfc/.
